CZUgoAbroad project

In October 2020, a unique project called CZUgoAbroad was created at CZU International Centre. The main aim and mission of this project is clear to increase awareness of exchange stays and motivate students to go abroad.



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What is Erasmus+?

Erasmus+ is the EU's exchange programme for students or fresh graduates. There are several types of exchange stays available:

Long-term mobility
Study Stay
Traineeship

Foreign language

Outgoing Erasmus students usually study in English. However, it is possible to also study in the language of the destination country.



English B1/B2 (or higher)

| Most universities require English language knowledge on level B1 or B2.

It is possible to take a language course organised by the Department of Languages before departure and get a confirmation of required language proficiency.

Other languages

| Erasmus allows students to study in the language of the destination country.

Reasons to go abroad

Long-term mobility

Long-term mobility belongs to the most popular exchange stay type among our students. This activity can help you to gain personal and study experience!



Study stay

| Every student (full-time and distance learning) can go abroad from the 2nd year of bachelor's studies.

| However, it is possible to apply during 1st year of bachelor's studies.

Traineeship

| Every student or fresh graduate can go abroad on a traineeship.

A student is considered to be a fresh graduate in a period of 12 months after graduation from the university. It is necessary to apply before graduation.

You can divide your 12 available months between **Erasmus+ study stay and traineeship**.

for example, 6 months of study stay (1-semester exchange) and then 2 times of a 2-month long traineeship

How to apply for a student mobility?

The whole application process can be described in 5 easy steps.



STEP 1: Select 2-3 destinations of your choice. You can use our Interactive Map (page 11) or a webpage of you faculty.

STEP 2: Contact your faculty International Relations Office (IRO) and let them know you would like to go abroad. IRO will give you instructions on when the selection procedure begins and what the requirements are for it. Don't be afraid, the selection procedure is not a difficult one!

STEP 3: Congratulations! You passed the selection procedure. Now, your faculty's IRO will inform the CZU International Centre about your successful passing. The International Centre will then inform you about the future steps, which are a couple of mostly online documents.

STEP 4: All the document are done, just the Grant Agreement for Participants to go. Download it from the UIS, sign it, deliver it and you are ready to go!

STEP 5: Everything is done. You will receive 80-100% of your scholarship before the mobility begins (and the rest during your stay).





There are no deadlines you can apply at any time. As for traineeship for graduates, please apply before state examination.

How to apply for a traineeship?

The whole application process can be described in 6 easy steps.



STEP 1: Find an organisation that will accept you. You can use our Interactive Map or simply search for a company of your choice on Google.

STEP 2: Perfect, you have the organisation. Now, contact your faculty International Relations Office (IRO) and let them know when would you like to go abroad. People from IRO can also help you with filling in the necessary documents.

STEP 3: In cooperation with the faculty IRO and the receiving organisation, make sure to prepare the Learning Agreement for your Traineeship.

STEP 4: Eventually your Learning Agreement needs to have the following signatures: yours, your faculty IRO, the receiving organisation, CZU International Centre.

STEP 5: Learning Agreement is done! Now just the Grant Agreement for Participants and you are ready to go!

STEP 6: Everything is done. You will receive 80-100% of your scholarship before the mobility begins (and the rest during your stay).







Additional financial support

Inclusion

| Students with fewer opportunities are eligible for extra support in terms of either additional scholarship or short-term mobility.

Food intolerance

| Students who have a food intolerance (celiac disease, Crohn's disease, lactose intolerance etc.) can get up to 250€/month as additional financial support.

Green Erasmus

| Students who use a green means of transport for journeys longer than 1200km can get a 50€ scholarship.

extra financial support for students with fewer opportunities is up to 250€/month



all students with additional obstacles can apply for




