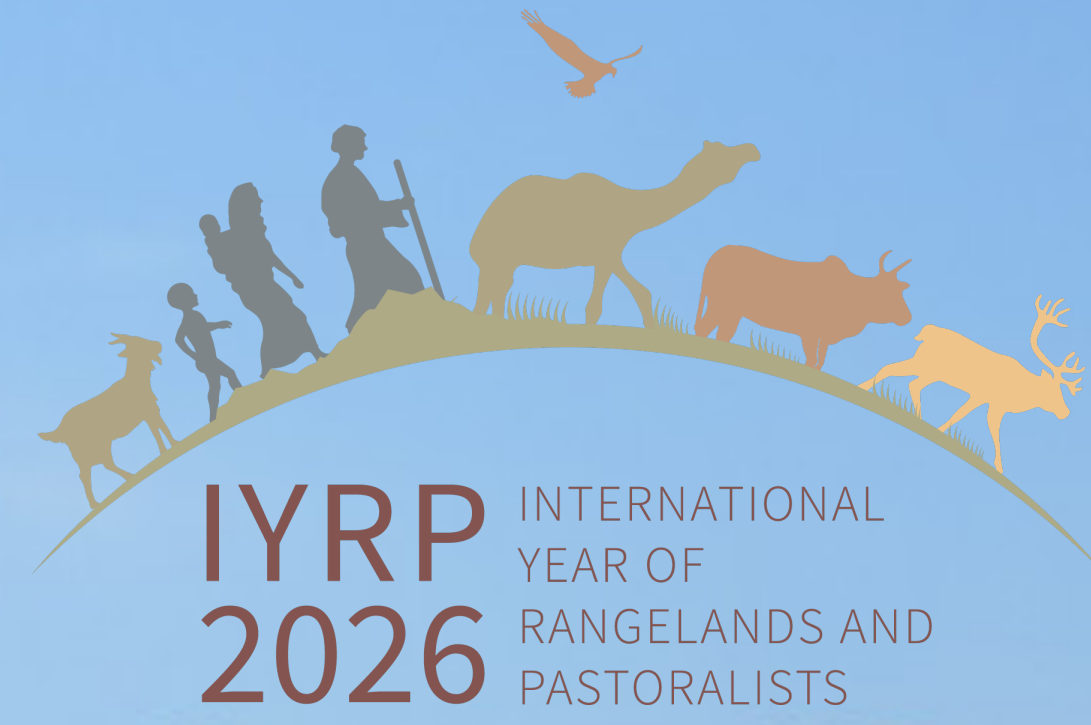


2nd edition of Perspectives on Pastoralism Film Festival

The *Perspectives on Pastoralism Film Festival* seeks to deepen understanding about how diverse peoples across the globe gain their livelihoods from mobile livestock husbandry.

The relationships of pastoralists, their animals and their food production systems reflect an intimate intertwining of culture, economy and ecology in highly variable environments, such as drylands and mountains, where herd mobility plays a key role.

The films selected in this second edition of the festival focus on ecologically appropriate use of natural resources, the rights of pastoralists to use and steward these resources, and the challenges they face in maintaining and developing their livelihood systems.

The film festival reveals pastoralism as a sustainable nature-based production system, a form of **agroecology** ideally suited for the rangelands and for today's climatic and economic uncertainties.
