Our Successes _ FTA Fight against COVID-19

The CZU Prague was placed first in the Czech Republic in the THE Impact Ranking 2020!

The FTA won the Best Faculty in the CR (according to the magazine Týden)

We had 77 IF & SRJ publications in 2019

The new FTA Building, a new state-of-the-art facility called "the green building" will be the latest addition to the campus of the Czech Life Science University (CZU). Prospective students of the Faculty of Tropical AgriSciences interested in the fields of tropical agriculture and developing countries can enjoy the new premises as of this fall/autumn semester. The facility will offer top-notch technology and space for scientific research.

14 research teams

We would like to proudly introduce 2 representatives from the FTA research group and laboratories who worked even during the Covid-19 pandemic in this Newsletter (please find all our teams here)

The Laboratory of Ethnobotany and Ethnopharmacology (LEE) team, led by Prof. Ladislav Kokoška, is helping to protect doctors and the elderly.

The focus of the laboratory is on the study of the chemistry and bioactivity of underutilized crops of tropical and subtropical origin. Plants of special interest are species used by native peoples in traditional folk medicinal systems.



The Covid-19 pandemic temporarily stopped the main research work of LEE, it caused the cancellation of several expeditions, e.g. to Ghana, Laos, the Philippines, and Thailand. But at least the LEE team helped prevent the spread of coronavirus infection!

Disinfection

The laboratory space was changed into "a factory" for the production of hand sanitizer according to the WHO guidelines with the registered name "Bez-infekce". A group of Ph.D. students initiated its preparation and distribution in hospitals and the care homes for the elderly, where the prevention of infection is so important at this time.

The Ecology, Evolution, Emergence & Epidemiology of Zoonoses (e4) Research Group, led by Dr. Jiří Černý, is focusing to SARS-CoV-2 virus research.

The group is focused on three main lines of research, to: 1) analyze mutations in the viral genomes which are available in data depositories. 2) work on a project focused on the development of a simplified method for virus detection which is supported by a TAČR Gama2 grant. 3) test which animal species are susceptible to virus infection.

We are testing

Our SARS-CoV-2 virus testing is focussed on all animals in intensive contact with humans. We are collaborating for example with the Dvůr Kralové ZOO, which is providing us with samples from monkeys kept there. The virus can pose a threat to all primates, in the wild or in captivity.

As to pets we are using social and traditional media to start a citizen science project the goal of which is to collect samples from pets belonging to owners who were diagnosed SARS-CoV-2 positive. We want to test which animal species can be open to infection.

If you know any veterinarians, please ask them if he/she can join in this research and inform their clients about it

The SIMPLE project coordinated by the FTA within Erasmus+ was officially finished in 2019 and made a real change in 6 universities in Asia! Thanks to our project, new alumni and career centres were created, 16 career days organised, staff and students were trained and we managed to encourage cooperation between the academic sector and the professional sector in the area of agriculture and life sciences in Cambodia, Indonesia and Thailand.

Derbianus Conservation - in close cooperation with the Wildlife Management and Conservation Research Team, is making the best of the connection of academia and the non-profit sector in biodiversity conservation. We offer extensive expertise in ecological studies, breeding management, technical support, environmental education and awareness across Western Africa.

ICRAF and the FTA have been recently jointly involved in domestication efforts on two indigenous African species – Adansonia digitata (the baobab) and Garcinia kola (the bitter kola).


